Nyanase is grateful to attend Sud Academy so she can achieve her dreams through education. She loves school, and is thankful for the feeding program, as it's often her only source of nourishment.

Laat Malok is a 20 year student at Sud Academy and comes from the Dinka tribe of Southern Sudan. He escaped from his home area to avoid forced recruitment into the army. After witnessing much bloodshed, he fled with other boys to a refugee camp in northern Kenya, then continued on to Nairobi. He joined Sud Academy last year and is learning to love, appreciate and recognize the human dignity of fellow students. He is happy and promises to work hard at school. He appreciates the loving environment at Sud Academy as this is something he hasn't experienced before.
