About 175 students attend Sud Academy, both Sudanese urban refugees and local Kenyan pupils as well. Over the years, the focus of the school has shifted to secondary level education (red vests and sweaters are worn by the high schoolers). However, some resources remain allocated to the 60 primary students that attend grades 3 through 8.

A grateful mother...

Mrs. Josephine Aduk is grateful for the existence of Sud Academy. She left Southern Sudan after her husband was killed when fighting broke out in December 2013. With the help of relatives, she fled with her kids to Kakuma Refugee Camp, but life was difficult there as well, so they travelled on to Nairobi. She has a total of 12 dependents, both her own kids and relations that she has taken under her wing. She tries to support her household by working as a hairstylist and doing casual chores. She's grateful that her kids are receiving an education at Sud Academy, as well as getting 2 meals a day, as there is often a shortage of food at home.
