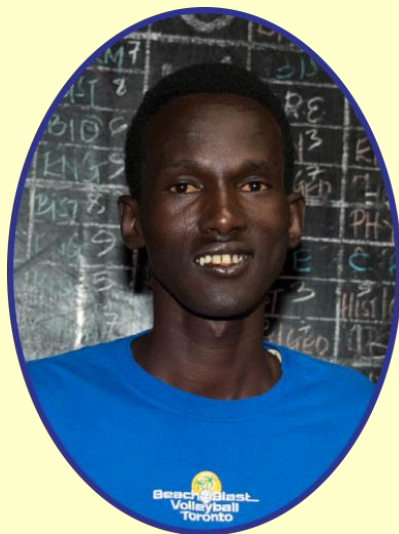
Please consider supporting our efforts to provide an education, school lunch, and a sense of belonging to these determined young people! See below for details of how to donate.
